Follow the general guidelines below and reference examples. Sources include but are not limited to a book, an interviewee (client, expert, etc.), and websites.

*Note: Teams can format citations using any style (i.e., guidelines on formatting, punctuation, and order). The use of a citation generator like Scribbr at <https://www.scribbr.com> is allowed.*

A proper citation includes <u>name</u> (of the author/ of the person being interviewed), <u>date</u> (of publication/interview), and <u>other applicable information</u> like title, page number(s), or link.
